Dying to drive?

We will be educating and informing young people about the risks of being a road user. We will cover the dangers of driving, the consequences of taking unnecessary risks and the vulnerability of being a passenger or pedestrian.

50/50 car

We will be informing drivers of their legal obligations of on-road car ownership as well as teaching them to be confident about what to look for when buying a used car. We will also be developing positive attitudes towards the benefits of road safety education, training and publicity.

Vehicle related ASB

We want to raise awareness of what constitutes vehicle related ASB within local communities. The programme will address issues that affect local communities and will involve looking at what can be done about these issues.

Distraction

The programme will look at distractions and the effects of using mobile technology while on the road. Guidance on the law will also be covered and case studies are used throughout.
