Eastern Neighbourhood Inspector's Report

As Spring approaches many will begin the endless list of jobs that have built up over the winter which often includes maintenance on properties. East Dorset remains a very safe place to live and work, but there has been an increase in breaks to garages, sheds and vehicles where tools have been stolen. Being a victim or witness to a crime can be distressing and traumatic, so Dorset Police have created a victims bureau dedicated to provide help and support.



Our Rural Crime team led by Verwood Neighbourhood Police have organised several proactive operations recently, some of which resulted in custodial sentences for the offenders. PS Nick Lee from the team has stated that it is often difficult to return items to their owners due to the lack of serial numbers being recorded or identifiable marks and recommends that you take the time to record serial numbers. Dorset Police are working together with www.immobilise.com where property details can be recorded by owners and searched by the Police to locate victims of crime.

We should never become complacent when deterring crime and I would suggest this is an ideal opportunity to assess your home and vehicle security. Phone and computer scams across Dorset remains a priority, with often those that are vulnerable amongst us targeted. If you think you've been a victim of fraud of any description or someone you know, please contact Action Fraud on www.actionfraud.police.uk; if a crime is in progress call the emergency number 999.

If you believe a member of your community is vulnerable please take the time to bring it to the attention of someone that can help, this can be a relative, GP, social services, Age UK or the Police. Advice on all the above and a lot more can be found on the Dorset Police web site www.dorset.police.uk including where Police approved security items at discounted prices can be obtained through the Ferndown Community Office, who helped and supported 2739 people during 2016.

Key Safes now available

A few years ago we sold a Key Safe, this would be fixed to an outside wall, a spare key kept in it and the combination number given to people who would need access to your house (carers, delivery, relations, etc). We stopped selling these items as they did not have Police approval. However, there is now a Police approved version available and we have



a supply at £35 each. A Neighbourhood Watch member is available to fit the Safe for a small charge.

During Office hours we can be contacted on 01202 876219, but please be aware that this number should not be used instead of 999 (a crime is being committed or life is in danger) or 101 for other incidents.

We would like to take this opportunity to inform residents of recent incidents in the area. This is in order for witness appeals, community awareness and vigilance and to remind residents to consider their own home security.

Man assaulted in Wimborne

Detectives are appealing for witnesses after a man was assaulted in Wimborne.

The incident happened sometime between 11.30pm and midnight on Saturday 21 January after the victim - a local man aged in his 40s - had left the Cricketers Arms on Park Lane.

He walked on his own toward Crown Mead when he was approached by

a group of men aged in their late teens near to the steps for Wimborne Library.

It is believed one of the men who was wearing a red jacket pushed the victim from behind and kicked him in the chest, causing him to fall over and hit his head on the ground. He was helped up by an unknown person, before walking home.

The victim began to feel unwell on Sunday evening, 22 January, and attended hospital where he was found to have a fractured skull and bleed on the brain. His injuries are not believed to be life-threatening. The incident was reported to the police on 23 January. Detective Constable Laura McQueen, of Bournemouth

Burglary in Wimborne

Officers are appealing for witnesses and anyone with information to come forward following a burglary at a craft centre in the Knobcrook area of Wimborne.

Sometime between 8.45 and 9.30pm on Sunday 22 January offenders gained access to Walford Mill Crafts on Stone Lane by smashing a front window.

The offenders then smashed a glass cabinet containing a large amount of jewellery which was stolen during the incident.

Police Constable Dave Hassell, of Wimborne Police, said: "I am appealing to anyone who saw or heard anything suspicious in the Knobcrook area during the relevant time to please contact Dorset Police. I am particularly keen to hear from anyone who has seen or been offered items of jewellery for sale in suspicious circumstances since the time of the incident."

Trading Standards News

A New Year, a new you, with a little help from food labelling

On 1st January, after the excitement and excesses of Christmas and all of that wonderful food, many of you may have made your New Year's resolutions, one of which may be to 'go on a diet' or 'eat more healthily'.

Changes in the requirements for food labels policed by Dorset Trading Standards may help you meet your goals.

From 13th December 2016, most packed food you buy in the shops has to be marked with detailed Nutritional Information. This information includes the all-important number of calories the food contains, along with the amount of other nutrients such as Carbohydrates, Sugar, Protein, Fat and Saturated fat. For those of you who are concerned about the amount of salt in your food, that information will now also be given.

As long as there is space on the label, the Nutritional Information is given in a table, usually on the back or side of the package. The figures quoted will be per 100g/ml to make comparisons between different foods easier and some manufacturers may also give information for 'servings' or 'slices'.

So if you want to make informed choices about the food that you eat or you are just watching your calories, take a closer look at the labels on your food.

The truth about dates: 'Use by' & 'Best before', safety and quality

In general food law requires pre packed food to have a date mark. Depending on the food type this is either a 'use by' date or a 'best before' date.

The 'use by' date is about safety and the most important date to remember! Foods can be eaten (and most can be frozen) up until the 'use by' date, but not after, unless it was frozen before



the 'use by' date. You will see 'use by' dates on food that goes off quickly, such as meat products or ready-prepared salads. For the 'use by' date to be a valid guide, you must carefully follow storage instructions.

The 'best before' date is about quality and not safety. The food will be safe to eat after this date but may not be at its best. Its flavour and texture might not be as good. The 'best before'

dates appear on a wide range of frozen, dried, tinned and other foods. The 'best before' date will only be accurate if the food is stored according to the instructions on the label.

After the 'use by' date, don't eat it, cook it or freeze it. The food could be unsafe to eat or drink, even if it is stored correctly and looks and smells fine.

For quick tips to save money, make time and reduce waste by eating, cooking or freezing food by its 'use by' date visit www.food.gov.uk/science/microbiology/use-by-and-best-before-dates

Shops can sell food once the 'best before' date has passed, however selling food past its 'use by' date is a criminal offence and can lead to prosecution. A supermarket in the Midlands

was recently prosecuted and fined £75,000 for selling which was past its 'use by' date.

Is your mattress safe?

Trading Standards have been cracking down on rogue traders selling illegal mattresses after an increase in complaints from consumers about cheap mattresses sold online or from the back of a van.

The law requires that mattresses meet a level of fire resistance as laid down in the British Standard, however it does not require that mattresses have a label to that effect.

Rogue sellers may entice customers into thinking they are getting a bargain, for example by saying that they are selling clearance stock, or excess stock from a large hotel order.

The mattresses typically fail all fire safety tests as well as being filthy and unhygienic. The items are often old and discarded mattresses that have been recovered and repackaged to look new. Some of the more brazen traders are even using the logos of well-known manufacturers and retailers on their vans to further fool consumers into believing they are 'bagging a bargain'. Paper work given with the mattresses may contain limited or false information.

Dorset Trading Standards Service has on two separate occasions prosecuted traders for selling mattresses which when tested failed the fire safety tests. Devon and Somerset Trading Standards have issued warnings to residents as complaints about mattresses increased tenfold in the period from 2014 to 2016.

Dorset Trading Standards Service advise that you do not purchase goods or services from people who approach you in the street or from callers who cold call on your doorstep. Local Officers Make Progress on Burglaries in the Area

Three men charged with attempted burglary offences

Officers investigating a reported attempted burglary at an address in Gussage St Michael near Wimborne have charged three men.

Dorset Police were called at 1.42am on Saturday 15 October 2016 to reports of break in at the property. Nothing was stolen.

Officers, supported by the Dog Section and NPAS helicopter, attended and carried out a search of the area. Three men were arrested a short time later.

The men aged 20, 21 and 24 and all from Poole have been charged with three counts of attempted burglary and are due to appear before Poole Magistrates' Court on 3rd February 2017.

Home Watch subs 2017-2020

The 'nominal' sub remains at £1 per year. However :-
