FUND-RAISING

During 2013 the fund-raising volunteers organised:

- the opening launch of the library;
- a Fish & Chip Cabaret;
- two Bazaars;
- a coach trip to the Houses of Parliament;
- Three Hidden Colehill Gardens with a cream tea;
- an evening of folk singing Friday Night is Music Night.

£2500 was raised for improvements to the library and for regular additions such as the daily newspapers and refreshments for the volunteers.

Plans are underway for more events in 2014 – in the first quarter alone we are organising 3 events (see above and overleaf). Details – and tickets where necessary – in the Library.

Subscriptions to the Friends of Colehill Library are important to us too, as a reliable source of income. Colehill Library Opens

Colehill's new £14,700 library will open to the public on Monday with a selection of 5000 books, including selections for children and large-print volumes for the partially sighted.

The library at the junction of Middlehill Road and Cannonhill Road, is the latest in the series of Dorset community and village libraries and replaces an informal service which had operated from the home of a resident for some time.

GLAZED

The new building is designed to fit in with the unusual shape of the site and to complement the surrounding pinewoods, and with the solid walls at each end clad in natural timber and the centre section wholly glazed.

Overall charge of the service will be maintained by Miss H.E. Wheeler, librarian, Wimborne group, but in direct charge of the new Colehill library will be a Colehill resident, Mrs Tina Southgate, who recently transferred from Ferndown and had earlier experience with Bournemouth public libraries.

Total cost of the building was £13,420 and furniture and shelving cost £1,325.
