We have our **AGM** on **August 30th** (2.30 at the Library). In the year to 31 March 2014 we concentrated on bringing the exterior up to standard and I hope you agree that the new frontage, with the new notice board and extended paving have made a difference. We spent a lot of money last year, but kept £5000 in reserve in case we need to replace some, or even all, of the roof at short notice.

The next stage is to catch up with the interior redecoration, and there will be reorganisation to improve space usage and efficiency. I was delighted that Colehill W.I. gave me a cheque for £150 as their nominated charity for 2013. Together with the accumulated funds from the Friends and the Parish Council grant we are in good financial shape, and I thank all our volunteers and supporters for their support for the Community Library.

At the AGM I will be retiring under the terms of our Articles. While I expect to stand for re-election for 3 years, we must plan for succession. Membership of the committee is open to anyone who feels they can help with managing the Community Library. It is not onerous and it is very rewarding being part of such a successful community facility. Please have a word with me or any committee member if you are interested in joining the team.

Summer Reading Challenge

It hardly seems possible that the Summer Reading Challenge is with us once again. Last year saw the volunteers embark upon this event with some trepidation, aware that the Challenge would be to our inexperience as much as to the reading of the local children! We were delighted with the achievements of Colehill's young readers and the enjoyment we had received in working with them.

We were given a target of signing up 120 young readers in the hope that a reasonable percentage would be able to read or share six books during the summer. We are proud to say that 180 children began the challenge at our Library and 140 received their medal and certificate at the end.

This year the theme is "The Mythical Maze" and features characters such as the Yeti and the Loch Ness Monster. The Challenge runs from 5th July - 6th September. Our young readers, between the age of 4 and 12 years will be encouraged to read or share six stories during this period. They will receive a poster and stickers to record their

progress. This year our under 4s will be encouraged to take part with a simpler process but also sharing six stories.

We will be holding a Reading Challenge day on Wednesday 23rd July from 10.00 – 4.00 which will offer the chance to sign up, listen to or share stories and make some mythical creatures. Do come and join us if you can.

Are we up to the Challenge this year? Wouldn't it be marvellous to sign up at least 200 children in 2014?
