Nature Note – Christine & Malcolm Storey

Visitors to the library may have noticed some fungi in the grounds in the last few weeks. One species was only obvious if you were peering hard at the recently dug ground around the solitary path light. The fruiting bodies of this fungus, an Earthstar, were practically the same colour as the dry, leaf littered soil; only their odd shapes gave them any visibility. With a bit of careful hunting we found both young, unextended specimens looking just like small, dirty onions nestled in the pine needles and two older fruitbodies that had opened up to around 6cm diameter. As the 'onion' matures it splits at the top and peels back forming triangular legs that eventually bend back enough to lift the whole fruitbody off the ground. Rain drops falling on the sack puff the spores into the air.

We are not sure which species we saw this year, but it is

different from those we spotted last autumn. There are 15 species of Earthstar in the UK. The picture is of one of the common species, the Collared Earthstar. The library grounds are a good place to spot wildlife.
