3/10/0134/COU*	Land at Bytheway Change of use of land from agriculture to allotments together with gravel car park, stock proof fencing and steel gate with barrier.  Refused because the application site includes a good example of semi-improved wet lowland meadow, a National Biodiversity Action Plan Habitat, and the ditch to which the car park will drain is part of a valuable network of watercourses running to the River Stour. The loss of the better parts of the application site habitat and the introduction of drainage without appropriate pollution controls would be contrary to Policy NCON5 of the East Dorset Local Plan 2002, which seeks to safeguard sites of nature conservation interest unless the need for the development outweighs the likely impact. In view of the poor quality of the site for the intended purpose, the balance of consideration favours the retention of it in its existing state.

## 506.10 CANFORD BOTTOM ROUNDABOUT

The Highways Agency had advised that a meeting to consult with local councillors on the roundabout would be arranged shortly.

## 507.10 PROPOSED REDEVELOPMENT OF GLYNVILLE COURT

Synergy Housing had given the Council a copy of a letter that had been sent to local residents answering their questions on the proposed redevelopment of Glynville Court.

#### 508.10 WIMBORNE ROAD - PARKING

Two residents had asked that the Council support their request to DCC to review the parking in Wimborne Road with a view to enforcing parking restrictions.

RESOLVED that the residents be informed that:

- (a) the Council was investigating the root cause of the parking problems;
- (b) the Council could not support their request as it was considered that other Wimborne Road residents would not appreciate having parking restrictions.

#### 509.10 BUS ROUTES AND SUBSIDIES

EDDC had requested a response to a number of questions regarding the bus routes.

RESOLVED that EDDC be informed of the following:

- (a) the routes through Colehill were invaluable to our residents;
- (b) there were no alternative routes at this time:
- (c) the Council was unable to assist towards the subsidy at this time;
- (d) there were no other economical ways of making the journeys. The Council would like EDDC to encourage car sharing by organising a scheme similar to the one that Dorset County, Bournemouth Borough and Borough of Poole were involved with.

## 510.10 AFFORDABLE RURAL HOUSING

The National Association of Local Councils had advised on proposals to give parish and town councils a special planning power to build new affordable homes. Unfortunately, this particular power would only be available to parish and town councils in settlements of less than 3000 people.

Cllr Packer advised on the challenges EDDC faced in providing affordable housing in the area. He said that the corporate plan was being re-written and it would place much more importance on providing affordable housing.

RESOLVED that EDDC be informed that the Council supported, in principle, the provision of affordable housing in Colehill.

## 511.10 MARSHFIELD RESIDENTS' GROUP

The Group's lottery application had been delayed, however the Chairman of the Marshfield Residents' Group had expressed his thanks for the Parish Council's interest in the aspirations of the Group.

The Chairman of the Group had arranged a meeting with residents and had asked that a Parish Councillor attend as he considered it would be beneficial for the residents to see the support available.

RESOLVED that Cllrs Wallace and Johnson attend the meeting on 26 May.

## 512.10 HIGHWAYS AND PLANS COMMITTEE 28 SEPTEMBER

RESOLVED that the meeting due to be held on 28 September be altered to 21 September.

#### 513.10 SPEED INDICATOR DEVICE

The Clerk reported that the SID fund contained £1162.34 and that Holt Parish Cllr Peter Finney would return the bracket and battery.
