As this is now the season of opportunist thefts - from cars, sheds, gardens and homes, I make no apology for repeating some of the sensible precautions we should be taking:

- Do not leave valuables on display in an unattended car
- Do <u>not</u> put a handbag or valuable items in the car boot after parking the car – someone could be watching
- Always close windows and lock the car when leaving it
- Always lock your bike when leaving it unattended
- Do <u>not</u> leave garden tools or machinery unattended in the garden
- <u>Always</u> keep the shed door locked when not in use or when it is out of your sight in the garden why not purchase a padlock and shed alarm if you do not already have them?
- Do <u>not</u> leave house windows open or doors open or unlocked when not around
- Do <u>not</u> buy from cold callers or let them into the house
- Once your house or shed is protected, <u>always</u> advertise the fact with a sign.

Crime prevention advice can be obtained from your Safer Neighbourhood Team, from the ADW website (www. nhwdorset.org.uk) or from the Ferndown Police Community Office in Ferndown, where they also have inexpensive security products available for purchase (see page 4). So please, heed the advice and encourage people in your neighbourhood to follow your example to be security conscious and crime-free this summer.

Holiday security checklist

If you are going on holiday this summer, please ensure you take the relevant precautions to make sure your home is safe and secure from burglars. Burglars target houses that look empty, so here is some advice on how to ensure your home is kept safe and secure so you don't come home to a nasty shock:

- Make sure your alarm, if you have one, is set
- Put lights on a timer switch to make your house look occupied. You can also get timer switches for the radio and/or TV
- Ask a neighbour to push post through your letterbox and take in any deliveries for you
- Cancel milk, newspapers and any other deliveries
- Ask a neighbour to park their car on your drive so that passers-by assume someone is home
- If you have a close friend or relative nearby with a key, ask them to draw your curtains in the evening and back in the morning. Don't leave curtains drawn during the day.
- If you have a lawn, mow it before you go away
- Don't display your home address on the outside of your luggage
- Don't publish your absence on the internet. Status updates, comments and photos on social media can all give away the fact that you are out of your home for an extended period
- Ensure any outdoor tools such as ladders are securely stored away as these could be used to force entry into your home
- Don't leave a message on your answer phone saying that you are away.

Report from Inspector Wayne Nock

Since my last update I'm pleased to report a drop in the number of shed and outbuilding burglaries. Your local Safer Neighbourhood Teams (SNT) have been working hard to keep public reassurance high with regular 'hot spot' patrols by both Police Officers and Police Community Support



Officers (PCSO) offering support, reassurance and crime prevention advice to all members of the community.

Unfortunately there has been a slight increase in the number of thefts from vehicles; recently there have been thefts in the Wimborne and Ferndown areas. Please be aware of the importance of removing any valuable items from your cars, ensuring they are locked and secure and parked, if possible, off the road on driveways or even better in garages.

We recently had an excellent result thanks to an alert resident; overnight we received a 999 call from a member of public who had heard a disturbance around his car. Directly because of the member of public's quick thinking in calling the police straight away we were able to catch and arrest 2 males for breaking into a number of cars. The pair have since admitted to other similar offences across North Bournemouth and East Dorset areas.

You, the public are our eyes and ears so please remember if you hear or see someone on your property that shouldn't be there, please call 999, it gives the Police the best opportunity of catching the criminals.

The Wimborne Folk Festival is a great event for the town but the extra people in the area and associated campsites attract thieves as well, last year sadly saw a number of tents being ransacked and valuables stolen. Again be aware and report anything suspicious.

Your SNT will be assisting with the National Home Watch Week running from the $14^{th}-22^{nd}$ June. At the various events being planned they will be available to speak to anyone who has concerns, or would just like to meet them, so please come along and have a chat to find out more about the excellent work our Watches are doing in East Dorset. Volunteers are the lifeblood of our communities so if this is something you think you could help and get involved with, please speak to one of my officers or anyone from your Home Watch, it is a rewarding, effective and worthwhile commitment.

On the subject of volunteers East Dorset has a thriving Special Constabulary which provides excellent support and resilience to the regular officers. The old song about not trusting a Special like an old time copper is a bit of fun

some initial teething trouble as computer systems will be being updated and this can often take longer than the front line response.

As it comes into the summer with the sunny weather and longer evenings (we can at least hope!) we would like to remind residents that valuables left on display are an easy target for car thieves! I know this is something we have often repeated but you'd be amazed by the number of times items are simply left on show. If you are using a rural car park do not leave any valuables in your vehicle, even in your car boot. Criminals watch you place all your valuables into the boot and they are still an easy target.

Unfortunately the usual parking complaints still continue to be an issue, particularly outside schools at pick up and drop off time. Please avoid parking on drop kerbs or on junctions as it makes crossing the road dangerous for your children.

Thankfully as a section East Dorset suffers very few burglaries to houses and sheds and garages. However, all residents are reminded to lock doors and windows when they are going out, even if for a short time. We also ask that you are a "good neighbour" and report any suspicious vehicles or persons DIRECTLY to the police on 101.

More recently we have had several reports of fake currency being used by persons in some of the shops within Wimborne. Please make sure you check any money handed to you as you do not want to fall foul of having worthless currency.

The new community messaging system, Dorset Alert, has suffered some teething problems. The Safer Neighbourhood Team would like to assure residents that they will begin to receive regular updates about various things that are going on in and around Wimborne.

Dorset Fire and Rescue Service – Home safety check

Sign up for a FREE Home Safety Check from us, online NOW!

Our staff will visit you in your home and fit or replace smoke alarms, we can give advice on escape routes, the use of candles, unattended cooking, electric blankets, overloading sockets, chimneys, low energy light bulbs and much more. This is all free of charge with the aim of encouraging you to think about fire safety in the home.

You can request a Home Safety Check online at www.dorsetfire.gov.uk go to 'SAFETY FIRST' then 'Fire Safety in the home', or call 0800 038 2323.

In 2012, Dorset Fire and Rescue Service attended 483 accidental fires in the home, at least half of the fires were caused by cooking. They could have been avoided if people were more aware of basic fire safety in their homes. Being aware of the dangers of fire and taking action could help save the lives of you and your family.

If you are asleep when a fire starts and you don't have a smoke alarm to wake you, your chances of surviving are zero.

Did you know you're twice as likely to die in a fire if you don't have a smoke alarm that works?

Did you know 90 people die each year because the battery in their smoke alarm was flat or missing?

The Four Million people scammed each year

Dorset County Council trading standards service is warning the public about fraudsters preying on hard-up households as part of a national scams awareness month.

Fraud offences in England and Wales rose by 25 per cent in 2013, compared to the previous year, with 207,252 cases reported. But nationally Citizens Advice has calculated up to four million people could be scammed each year as many scams go unreported.

There are many ways that fraudsters operate scams including post, telephone, text, email, websites and by fax.

Ivan Hancock, Trading Standards service manager for Dorset County Council, said:

"We are working as part of an initiative, coordinated nationally by Trading Standards, to identify Dorset scam victims from information gathered during police seizures of scam mail correspondence with international fraudsters.

Officers are currently working through an initial list of 600 potential Dorset scam victims and contacting victims. Our officers offer practical advice with information from the national scam prevention charity 'Think Jessica'.

The majority of those identified in Dorset so far have been older people and it is quite common, even for those who have lost considerable amounts of money, to keep that from their friends and family."

Officers found one scam victim repeatedly targeted by international postal scams who had been sending off £30 a week for over 10 years. Another victim was persistently contacted by 55 scam businesses receiving approximately 10 pieces of post a day which they replied to. In a third example a victim had written a letter to an international scam catalogue apologising for not to be able to make a further order to release their £13,000 winning cheque as they had no more money left to pay their bills.

Cllr Colin Jamieson, the county council's Cabinet member for community services, said:

"Trading Standards are on the frontline in protecting the public from these scams. Their work aims to make it tougher for scammers to take advantage of our most vulnerable residents.

By abusing normal business communication channels these fraudsters are also generally undermining consumers' confidence and trust which can in turn have a negative impact on legitimate businesses trading fairly."

The Trading Standards Institute and Citizens Advice have produced their top tips for dealing with scams:

- 1. If it sounds too good to be true it probably is
- 2. Never give out your bank details or send money unless you are certain you can trust the person contacting you
- 3. Contacted out of the blue? Be suspicious
- 4. Your bank and the police will never collect your bank card, ask for your PIN or come to your home
- 5. Make sure the website's secure, if you are buying online - check for the padlock or "https" next to the web address
- 6. It you haven't bought a ticket you can't win it

- 7. You shouldn't have to pay anything to get a prize
- 8. Pressure to make a decision straight away? Take your time and just say: 'No thank you'
- 9. Walk away from job ads that ask for money in advance
- 10. Computer firms do not make unsolicited phone calls to help you fix your computer
- 11. Don't suffer in silence tell others about scams

More on BANK SCAMS

Detectives investigating a series of incidents where people were targeted by fraudsters at their homes are renewing their appeal for witnesses and issuing a warning to the public – after at least 11 victims of similar crimes have come forward.

Dorset Police issued a witness and information appeal after four phone bank scams were reported to Dorset Police which involved the victim receiving a phone call from a person posing as a Police Officer.

The victim is informed of a possible fraudulent transaction going out of their bank account and is advised to call the bank to report it. The scammers then hold the phone line open by not hanging up at their end. When the victim then phones the bank, they are still connected to the fraudster and divulge bank details to them.

A further 11 crimes of a similar nature have been reported across the county. Dorset Police are now warning all members of the public to be vigilant and note the following advice:

- Do not reveal your bank details including PIN to anyone - banks will already have these details.
- If you receive an unexpected call from someone claiming to be from your bank, do not give them any details, hang up and call your bank on their regular contact telephone number using a different telephone and phone line.
- Do not give your bank cards to strangers whatever reason they may give you to part with them.
- Do not allow inside your home any unknown or unexpected callers. If you are suspicious call 999 immediately.
- Do not hand over any cash to people unknown to you.

Detective Inspector Mark Samuel, of Bournemouth and Poole CID, said: "We believe that these crimes are happening nationally and it is possible that many more have not been reported. If you are in doubt about the origin of a call, check with your bank. Anyone who has become a victim of such an offence and has yet to report this should contact Dorset Police on 101. We'd urge people to dismiss any calls they receive like this and report them by calling Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040."

Alternatively, call the free and anonymous Crimestoppers line on 0800 555 111 where mobile phone tariffs may apply.

Home Watch subs 2014 - 2016

Year-end change to '31st March'

In order to align subs with our new year-end, members with current subs which expire on 30th September 2014 will be eligible for free renewal for the 18 months up to 31st March 2016.

Existing members will receive a new membership card in September, valid until **31st March 2016**.

New members (or lapsed members) will pay a '**joining sub**' of £2 from 1st April 2014.

Note that membership is per household, not per person.

If you move house within our Home Watch area your membership can be transferred to your new address free of charge and a new card will be issued to you. Members who move out of the area will forfeit any subs paid and new occupiers will need to join up in their own names.
