Summer Reading Challenge 2021



Some of our newer members may have not yet heard about the FUN, FREE and EXCITING challenge that comes to libraries each summer but we are sure that our regular participants will agree that nowhere is it undertaken more enthusiastically than at Colehill.

This is a nature themed Challenge which will inspire young readers to stand up for the planet. It is directed towards young people from 4 - 11 yrs of age but we always welcome children of all ages. Some of our youngest borrowers received their first medal before they had learned to read but were happily sharing books with their older siblings. They have gone on to take part year after year and have a collection of medals and certificates to be proud of.

The aim is to read (or listen to) six books of your own choice during the summer and tell our librarians about them. Each time you read a book you will receive a special sticker. When you have completed all six you will receive a medal and a certificate will be presented to you in the library or at school, whichever you prefer.

What you need to do:

- Join the library if you are not already a member
- Sign up for the Challenge from the 3rd July
- Choose your books either all six or one or two at a time
- Enjoy reading or sharing your book
- Come to the library and briefly tell one of our librarians about your book
- Receive a sticker
- Add your name to our progress chart
- Receive your medal when you have all six stickers
- Allow your name to be entered in to our special prize draw to win a book

Ancestry and Family History Help

There is still free online access from home until the end of September 2021. Just go to **LibrariesWest**.org.uk, select the "Family History" box and follow the instruction to log in to Ancestry. You will need your library membership details.
