It's that time of year again as we look forward to the **Summer Reading Challenge**. Previous participants will know that, supported by Dorset Libraries, Colehill accepts the Reading Agency's national challenge to keep young people reading through the summer holidays.

This year's Summer Reading Challenge, 'Ready, Set, Read!' is all about games and sports. Children will join our fictional team (and their animal mascots) as they use their skills to weave their way through a summer obstacle course.

Developed in collaboration with Youth Sport Trust, the 2023 Summer Reading Challenge will celebrate play and participation, encouraging children to engage in games and sports in any way that best suits them. 'Ready, Set, Read!' will showcase how reading can be active and engaged and can itself involve teamwork and community.

As library books are read on the 2023 Summer Reading Challenge, participants will receive a host of stickers, some with smells. When six books have been read a 'Ready, Set, Read!' medal will be presented and your certificate will be sent to your school.

The Challenge runs from 1 July to 23 September 2023

#### **Digital Newspaper Service**

Digital newspapers have moved from the Libby / Press Reader service to BorrowBox.

To access digital newspapers on BorrowBox, install the BorrowBox app on to your device (if you don't already have it) or go to the website (see below), then log on with your library membership number and PIN. If you need a PIN reminder, click on 'Log in' and 'Forgot my PIN'.

All titles can be accessed simultaneously by an unlimited number of library members, and back copies will also be available. Details can be found by clicking on 'Digital Newspapers' at www.librarieswest.org.uk

#### **Home Library Service**

For those of you unable to visit your local library because of illness, disability, self-isolation, or because you are a carer, volunteers from the Royal Voluntary Service can deliver books or audiobooks to your home every 3 weeks.

If you are interested in using this service or know of someone who might be eligible to use it, please pick up a leaflet from Colehill Library, or contact Wimborne Library on 01202 882770. An RVS volunteer will then contact you to discuss your reading interests, and organise deliveries. There is no charge for this service.

## **Recycling Update**

HEARING AIDS – we are pleased to say that we are now able to accept hearing aids for recycling on behalf of Wimborne and Ferndown Lions Club.

SPECTACLES – we continue to accept spectacles. These are collected by the local Lions and are then delivered to Chichester Lions Club who sort them and deliver them to Medico, France who then distribute them around the World. POSTAGE STAMPS – these are passed on to Forest Holme Hospice in Poole.

USED PENS.... Pens, felt tips, highlighters and markers can all be recycled, as well as mechanical pencils, correction tapes, fluid pots, fountain pens and ink cartridges. These are passed to our colleagues at Bridport Library who send them to TerraCycle to be recycled into other products such as watering cans and park benches.
