John Gooch steps down as Colehill Library Chairman — end of an era!

Ardent, tenacious and successful campaigner to keep Colehill Library open for the Community.

John Gooch's active involvement and support for the library goes back to the days of the early threats of closure by DLS; three of which were resisted.

Finally in 2011 Dorset Council announced that it was intending to withdraw its financial support for nine libraries including Colehill.

In December that year, more than 120 people came forward as volunteers to run a community library.

Being on the Parish Council at the time of the last most serious threat, he was active in setting up CLAG (Colehill Library Action Group) formed from members of the Friends Committee and the Parish Council. They held direct discussions with DCC and EDDC. John also attended some of the meetings with AdLib, the group formed from representatives from library friends groups campaigning to save Dorset's 20 threatened libraries

In February 2012 Colehill Community Library was set up at the first Committee meeting chaired by John. The choice of, and acceptance by, John as Chairman was very important in view of the need to deal with the considerable weight of legal and financial machinations to come. He worked with David Mitchell to secure the financial support of the Parish Council. This was assured when the residents of Colehill responded to a questionnaire and agreed to pay a small extra sum on the Council Tax to be used specifically to run the library.

As John explained twelve months later, "last year we started as a committee of volunteers, decided to become a private limited company limited by guarantee, and have applied to become a charity, which we hope will happen in March".

During this time John was supported by a growing number of very able volunteers. However it is doubtful if anything could have been achieved so successfully without John's considerable drive and high level of activity. Much of this work was challenging, time consuming (and often tedious). Colehill Library finally became community managed on 8th January 2013 and celebrated the official opening on the 9th February, fittingly National Libraries Day that year.

John's energetic work has continued to this day, overseeing along the way a number of necessary, expensive projects (windows, roof, etc.) to ensure the structural integrity of the building.
