3/19/1258/HOU	6 Hayes Lane Raise/extend roof to form additional living accommodation at first floor level. The proposal is much more ambitious than this description. The ridge height is not to be increased greatly and the change from a hipped roof to a gable with a front-facing first floor window does not detract from the street scene. The increased bulk should not inconvenience the neighbours, and the well-designed internal changes will provide much improved accommodation.
	Nevertheless, the Colehill Parish Council has no objection to this application.
3/19/1504/FUL	Garage Court at New Merrifield Erect a pair of 3 bedroom semi-detached houses with associated parking.
	Cllr Morawiec commented that this goes against the spirit of the Housing Association to build like this. Cllr Bridle said that this could be setting a precedent for other garage block to be knocked down and built on. Cllr Johnson said that it was too small, lots of overlooking and too cramped and inconvenient. It would completely deprive New Merrifield of parking and disadvantage other residents.
	The Chairman summarised the discussion which was that Colehill Parish Council should object strongly to this application by Aster, a housing association. Removal of the

garage forecourt will have a profound effect on the many residents of New Merrifield where parking on the narrow roadways/tracks is extremely difficult. It may be true that the garages are not suitable for modern cars, but they have their uses and more so the forecourt. Furthermore, while the proposed semi-detached houses may have sizes of accommodation to national standards, the designs of the bathrooms and bedroom 3 are awkward and impractical.
