## 282.18 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

# 283.18 PLANNING APPLICATIONS

Development Proposed
Spectrum 32B Beaucroft Lane Proposed sunroom at new 1st floor level extension.
Objection. The Council supports the neighbours' objections and considers that the new design is even more overpowering on the green belt. It is noted that permission has not yet been granted for PA 3/18/2578/CONDR and yet this new application relies upon it being granted.  The Council respectfully draws the Planning Authority's attention to a previous decision that the site has reached its potential and that no further development should be permitted.
Park Farm, Leigh Road Approval of reserved matters application in respect of appearance, layout scale and landscaping (including pumping station and SUD's) following outline planning application 3/15/0789/COU for residential development of 305 dwellings with associated roads, parking, turning and amenity areas; provision of local centre; provision of public open space and landscaped areas at Land at Park Farm, Leigh Road, Wimborne, Dorset, BH21 2DA.  No objection.

3/18/3135/HOU	33 Ashmeads Close Two storey front extension. Add pitched roof to attached garage. Change tile hung detail to timber cladding.  No objection.
3/18/3305/FUL	Land South of Leigh Road, Wimborne A hybrid application comprising:  1) An outline application for the erection of 174 dwellings, with all matters reserved save for means of access.  2) A full planning application for the erection of a community sports facility comprising club house, playing pitches, parking and landscaping together with the change of use of the land to leisure.  Comment: The Council has noted that the sports ground has been moved to another part of the site and that the affordable housing is now going to be in the odour zone. The Council hopes that all necessary measures are in place to
	address any issues that may arise from this.  The Council asks whether the lack of any transport links will be addressed (Policy KS9) and if the development reflects the needs of the people (Policy LL1).  The Council also wishes to report that large planning applications such as this cannot be downloaded in one go due to the deficiencies of the planning portal.

# 287.18 APPLICATIONS TO DE-REGISTER PARTS OF LEIGH COMMON (CLD2016/1 & CLD2017/1)

Members NOTED that Cllr Dover would be attending the DCC Regulatory Committee meeting on 6 December to represent the Council and would speak about the applications to de-register parts of Leigh Common by advising on the following:

- the proposed road alteration is, on its north side, next to a SANG (BytheWay);
- any intrusion on that footway and verge will impact upon a well-used footpath and an important drainage ditch and will be close to an access to a heavily used children's play area;
- the land has been in 'common use' for more than 20 years and is similar to adverse possession;
- if de-registration is intended to give a widened area on which to put the new road junction it should be done by taking land from the southern side alone.

#### 288.18 SCHOOL CROSSING

Members considered an email from a resident who had witnessed an altercation between a cyclist and the school crossing patrol at Middlehill Road. The resident said that the cyclist had almost failed to stop and had shouted that it should not have been a crossing. The resident asked whether there were any measures that could be taken to highlight the crossing and to encourage drivers and/or cyclists to reduce their speed.

RESOLVED that DCC's Safer Travel Officer be asked to attend the site to determine that all appropriate measures were in place and to consider whether any changes were required.

## 289.18 BEAUCROFT FOUNDATION SCHOOL

Cllrs I Dickins, Lawrence, King and Urquhart recently met with the head teachers of Beaucroft School to discuss the School's expansion plans over a five year period, in order that a decision could be made as to whether to contribute towards DCC's plans for extra on-site parking.

Cllr King said that the meeting provided a good insight into the running of the school and the pressures that they faced. He said that DCC Children's Services needed to clarify the information that they and DCC Planning had provided so that the Council could understand why funding was required and what it would be used for. Cllr King also said that if the Council did decide to contribute then it would need to be linked to a policy that expected staff to use onsite spaces first, rather than parking on the road.

It was AGREED that the Clerk would seek clarification from Children's Services and report the findings at a future meeting.

## 290.18 PLANNING GUIDANCE

Cllr King said that at October's public meeting a resident, who was a chartered town planner, had offered his services, free of charge, to help with any planning queries the Council had.
