A donation is requested to cover expenses.



Government Emergency Alerts system is being trialled

The government's new Emergency Alerts system is being tested and will be live soon – you should expect to receive a test message. The system will enable people to be contacted via their mobile phone when lives are in danger.

It will be used to warn you in the event of emergencies, such as severe flooding. Emergency Alerts are sent to all compatible mobile phones within an area of risk. They don't track your location, need your phone number, or collect personal data.

Only the government and the emergency services will be able to send them. If you don't have a mobile phone, you'll still be kept informed through other channels.

If you get an Emergency Alert on your phone, you'll hear a loud, siren-like sound. A message on your screen will tell you about the emergency and how best to respond. You'll be able to check an alert is genuine at gov.uk/alerts.

If you receive an alert, read the alert carefully and follow the instructions. You can opt out of receiving emergency



alerts; for more information on how to opt out or to find out more please go to gov.uk/alerts .

Buy Safe

- Only shop at reputable retailers, as not only does this increase the likelihood that the product will be safe, but it also means that you will be entitled to a refund if there is a fault.
- Don't always trust online reviews, these can easily be faked.
- Look for the UKCA mark on products such as toys, electrical goods and cosmetics. This ensures that the product has been tested to comply with safety standards.
- Make sure toys and other goods are suitable for children by checking the age range of the item, and never leave a child unattended with a toy that contains small parts.
- Ensure that any item that uses button batteries has a lockable battery compartment.
- Do not buy fakes or counterfeits, it funds criminality, can be poor value for money and is a serious potential safety

If you have seen or have bought something that you think is unsafe, then report it to Trading Standards, by calling the Citizens Advice consumer helpline on 0808 2231133.

The system is designed to allow people who register, to choose the type of information they would like to receive concerning crime and crime prevention.

Wimborne & Colehill Report

The Team's operational priorities remain the tackling Anti-social behaviour (ASB), burglary, rogue traders and distraction crimes.

Anti-social Behaviour

PS Payne explains that most local ASB is perpetrated by the younger generation riding e-scooters, skateboards, bikes and causing a 'general nuisance' around premises and at carparks – Redcotts, Olivers Park and Leigh Park areas etc.

The NPT maintains more patrols in these places to engage with persistent offenders; often words of caution are all that is necessary.

For those who do not respond to advice, the NPT initiates the Community Consequence Scheme involving parents, who often are unaware of their children's behaviour, and other relevant agencies.

There are three stages:

- 1. A letter sent from Dorset Police to parents. This is generally all that's needed.
- 2. A visit by an NPT officer to the family home.
- 3. Invoking sanctions such as ASB Dispersal Orders

(Where the police have powers to break up groups of causing a nuisance, harassment or distress). PS Payne remarked that the Scheme has a very high compliance rate and rarely requires Stage 3.

The Police have further powers should it be necessary, including legal injunctions, Community Protection Notices (CPN), and in Dorset the 'Community Trigger' through which victims of ASB can request a review of their case and bring agencies together to take a joined up, problem solving approach to find a solution.



By the time you read this Spring should be arriving. As is our habit at this time of the year we all start to work outdoors tidying up from the ravages of the past winter.

However do be cautious. If you are working in the front of your property and it is time for a well earned cuppa, do not leave garden tools, either hand or power, unattended for any length of time. Certainly never leave such things outside overnight. These Items are easily disposed of at car boot sales!

Also keep those garden tools locked up in the shed or garage when not in use. There have been burglaries in the past where a garden spade was used to open French windows.

Conversely when working at the back of your property make sure the front door and any windows are secure. It only takes a few minutes to remove something through an unsecure opening.

Do also watch out for bogus gardeners calling door to door. They will not have third party insurance or use proper tools. Do check that they are willing to give you a written quote, you can then cancel within 14 days. Check their business name, if they have one, this may be on Checkatrade or similar site. If you do not wish to give them work ask them to leave, preferably with a

witness present. If they do return in the future you should call the Police.

Home Watch subs 2020-2024

The 'nominal' sub remains at £1 per year. However :-

As of 1st April 2020, **Existing** members were eligible for free renewal and received a new membership card valid until **31st March 2024.**

NEW members (or lapsed members) pay £2 and receive the new card, valid till 31st March 2024.

Note that membership is per household, not per person.

If you move house within our Home Watch area your membership can be transferred to your new address free of charge and a new card will be issued to you. Members who move out of the area will forfeit any subs paid and new occupiers will need to join up in their own names.
