

A donation is requested to cover expenses.



DORSET & WILTSHIRE FIRE AND RESCUE

Community Safety Plan

A consultation has been launched for Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Authority's proposed new Community Safety Plan.

The plan sets out the priorities and challenges for Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service from now until 2028, covering areas such as prevention, protection, response, governance and people. Chief Fire Officer Ben Ansell said: "The plan details how we intend to continue working, but also what we intend to review and do differently to meet and reduce the risks we face as an organisation. Public sector finances are under extreme pressure, so it is vital that we look at all parts of the Service to ensure that we are working as efficiently and as effectively as possible."

The consultation runs until 9am on Friday 3 May. Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Authority will then consider the consultation responses and the final plan at its meeting in

Wimborne & Colehill Report

Our Policing Priorities remain the same and these are Tackling Anti-Social Behaviour, Burglaries and Drugs use/supply.

I am aware of a recent increase in Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) in the area. I regularly monitor local Facebook Pages but as you can see by the Stats that have been supplied, the reports made to police do not reflect this increase. This is not just a Wimborne and Colehill issue but is county wide. **Please could you report all ASB to the Police.** I cannot guarantee that we are able to attend every report, but building a better picture of the ASB in the area allows me to task officers to the right locations at the right time.

As a Team we have been working closely with several shops in the area. I am aware that the community's perception is that thefts from shops are not dealt with by the Police. The increase in the Crime Figures in Thefts are because of the interaction with the shops. As a result, more of the thefts are being reported, resulting in several persons being prosecuted / in the process of being prosecuted.

A recent operation in the area including several other Neighbouring Police Teams result in a Warrant being executed at an address and stop searches of two youths. All being dealt with for Drug related Offences.

The crime statistics below & pg 3 show how safe a place we live in.

Behind the reporting: Intelligence led policing

Does this sound familiar when an incident or issue occurs in your community?

- What's the point of reporting?
- They won't do anything!
- They can't do anything!
- Someone else has probably reported it!
- They are not interested!
- Never see the police!



You may often find people turn to social media to share their experiences, frustration, or anger, which in turn attracts more negativity to the issue. All of this can negatively impact the quality of life of the community and become a self-fulfilling prophecy and here's why....

Not reporting means it is invisible to the police and the council.

The police and council will always prioritise resources for areas with an identified issue. This means areas where there are no reported issues may not receive as much proactive policing as areas where there is an identified problem.

Without reporting, valuable pieces of information will remain missing. Identifying and dealing with offenders often requires piecing together a range of information over time. You may have that vital piece of information that will help tackle a wider issue. If you don't report, then it gives the offender a potential "get out of jail free" card.

It perpetuates the belief that the police aren't interested; if they are not aware, how can they be? Besides, if you feel that more should be done, the council operates an incident review process to revisit the situation if it continues.

Anti-social behaviour includes a range of issues from graffiti to vandalism, street drinking, noisy/nuisance behaviours and more. By not reporting these, conditions will become embedded into a community and erode the overall quality of life, making it harder to address over time.

In 1867 the British philosopher and political theorist John Stuart Mill said, "Bad men need nothing more to compass their ends than that good men should look on and do nothing."

It is the same today as over 150 years ago: by not reporting, the only winner is the offender!

What happens when you report?

Dorset Police in a year dealt with 121,798 emergency calls, 185,000 incidents, \$\infty\$ 5,800 missing people and over 7,500 mental health incidents. The force made 10,515 arrests.

Officers and staff equally feel the frustrations of not being able to attend every single report, but there are only a finite number of personnel available at any one time, and every day call handlers make difficult decisions to prioritise deployment where there is the greatest risk of vulnerability and harm.

In dealing with Anti-Social Behaviour, an approach based on Intelligence-led policing, has proven highly effective in not only dealing with the situation but removing it.

The approach involves working with partners such as the council and through a joint effort, looks to identify and deal with offenders, change, and improve the physical environment and reassure residents.

So, even if you think there is no point in reporting, the first step in tackling the issue starts with you.

of your property and it is time for a well earned cuppa, do not leave garden tools unattended for any length of time. Certainly never leave such things outside overnight.

These items are easily disposed of at car boot sales!

Conversely when working at the back of your property make sure the front door and any windows are secure. It only takes a few minutes to remove something through an unsecure opening.

Do also watch out for bogus gardeners calling door to door. They will not have third party insurance or use proper tools. Do check that they are willing to give you a written quote, you can then cancel within 14 days. Check their business name, if they have one, this may be on Checkatrade or similar sites. If you do not wish to give them work ask them to leave, preferably with a witness present. If they do return in the future you should call the police.

Enjoy the coming summer but try and out-think the criminal element.

W&C Home Watch subscriptions 2024 - 2028

The 'nominal' sub remains at £1 per year. However :-

As of 1st April 2024, **EXISTING** members with blue '2024' cards are eligible for free renewal until 31st March 2028 using the 'extension' printed left.

NEW members (or lapsed members) pay £2 and receive a new white card, valid till 31st March 2028.

Note that membership is per household, not per person.
